/ Law

■ Online Platforms

The Council formally adopted the regulation on promoting fairness and transparency for business users of online intermediation services. The new rules aim at providing a more transparent and fair online business environment and also oblige all platforms to set up an efficient internal system for handling complaints. The platforms covered by the regulation include online market places, online software application stores and online social media, online search engines that serve business users established within the EU and offer goods or services to consumers located within the EU. The regulation will now be published in the EU Official Journal and will enter into force on the 20th day after that.

■ Digital Policy

The Council adopted conclusions on the post-2020 digital policy, to boost digital and economic competitiveness across the Union.

■ Cybercrime

The Council adopted the mandate authorising the European Commission to participate in the negotiations on a second additional protocol to the Council of Europe Convention on Cybercrime.

■ Emission Standards for Heavy-duty Vehicles

The Council adopted for the first time CO2 emission standards for trucks. The regulation sets out binding

targets in order to cut carbon dioxide emissions from new heavy-duty vehicles by 15% from 2025 and by 30% from 2030, compared with the levels of 2019. This is the final step in the legislative procedure. The regulation will now be published in the EU Official Journal and it will enter into force on the 20th day following that of its publication.

■ Emissions Testing

The EC presented a proposal to reinsert certain aspects of Real Driving Emissions testing (RDE) into legislation to be adopted by the European Parliament and Council. Once adopted by the two co-legislators, the regulation will be directly applicable in all Member States. Last December the General Court annulled some of the provisions of EU legislation on Real Driving Emissions testing. The text will be available soon.

■ Clean Vehicles

The Council adopted a directive on the promotion of clean and energy-efficient vehicles, which will introduce binding targets for zero- and low-emission vehicles in public procurement. The directive will enter into force 20 days after its publication in the EU Official Journal. Member States will then have two years to adopt national provisions and will need to report to the Commission on the implementation of these rules every three years.

Chemicals

The Council adopted a new regulation on persistent organic pollutants. The regulation will update the current rules, bringing them in line with the latest amendments to the Stockholm Convention on the elimination of the production, use, import and export of persistent organic pollutants. The regulation will enter into force on the 20th day following that of its publication in the Official Journal of the EU and it will be directly applicable in all Member States.

Banking Union

EU Ministers for Finance discussed a progress report on the state of play of the Banking Union, with a special focus on the proposal to establish a European Deposit Insurance Scheme, on risk reduction measures and on initiatives to tackle non-performing loans. With regard to this last point, the European Commission presented its fourth progress report on the reduction of non-performing loans.

■ Economic and Monetary Union

The EC published a Communication on the Economic and Monetary Union. The European executive invites Member States to take further steps to strengthen the single currency area. In particular, to reach an agreement on the main features of the Budgetary Instrument for Convergence and Competitiveness and to finalise the amendments to the Treaty establishing the European Stability Mechanism.

Capital Markets Union

The Council adopted a package of measures aimed at removing existing barriers to the cross-border distribution of investment funds. The new rules will enter into force on the 20th day following that of the publication in the EU Official Journal.

■ European Personal Pension Product

The Council adopted the regulation on a pan European personal pension product, which creates a new type of voluntary product. The regulation will enter into force 20 days later its publication in the EU Official Journal.

■ Financial Transaction Tax

EU Finance Ministers had a policy debate on the new draft for a financial transaction tax. Since the original proposal of the European Commission did not have the necessary support at the EU level, discussions on such a tax continued in the framework of enhanced cooperation. The countries involved in the works are Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Greece, Estonia, Portugal, Slovakia and Slovenia. The new draft is based on a Franco-German proposal, which will reduce the scope of the original text of the Commission. In order to reach a final agreement among the Member States participating in the enhanced cooperation, further work is needed.

Company Law

The Council adopted a directive that amends the Directive 2017/1132. In particular, the new rules aims at promoting the use of online tools in the contacts between companies and public authorities. The directive will soon be published in the EU Official Journal and it will enter into force on the 20th day following that of its publication. The new rules will apply two to four years from the date of its entry into force.

■ Brexit

The EC released its fifth Brexit Preparedness Communication, which contains an update of the preparations of the contingency measures for the

withdrawal of the UK from the Union. Of the nineteen legislative proposals tabled by the Commission, there is only one that still has to be formally adopted. In light of the continued uncertainty in the country, a nodeal scenario on 1 November remains very likely.

■ Market Surveillance and Compliance of Products

The Council adopted a regulation to strengthen market surveillance in order to ensure that products placed on the market comply with the European legislation. The regulation will amend Directive 2004/42/EC and Regulations 765/2008 and 305/2011. The new rules will enter into force on the 20th day following publication in the EU Official Journal and will become applicable two years after the date of entry into force.
