■ Commission Work Programme

The EC presented its Work Programme for the year 2023 which contains 43 new policy initiatives and a series of proposals to be reviewed. In particular, the European executive intends to present in early 2023 a comprehensive reform of the EU's electricity market and to create a European Hydrogen Bank. Action to reduce waste and environmental impact of waste, with a focus on food and textile sectors, is also on the agenda. In the first quarter of the year the Commission intends to release its European Critical Raw Materials Act. A proposal on a common European mobility area space, the revision of the EU rules on payment services and action to upgrade and expand the use of digital tools and processes in company law will also be released in the coming months. Amon the legislation to be reviewed there is the targeted revision of the REACH regulation and of the European rules on chemical data.

The Commission will also withdraw some existing proposals, such as the proposal to amend Regulation 715/2007 on type approval of motor vehicles with respect to emissions from light passenger and commercial vehicles (Euro 5 and Euro 6) and on access to vehicle repair and maintenance information because of its obsolescence following judgement of the Court of Justice C-177/19, C-178/19 and C-179/19 on the type approval of motor vehicles.

The Commission will now start discussions with the European Parliament and the Council to establish a list of priorities on which co-legislators will take swift action.

Energy Crisis

The EC presented an additional proposal to tackle high energy prices and ensure security of supply. The new

measures will enable joint gas purchasing; create a new complementary price benchmark for LNG and a framework to propose a price correction mechanism for transactions on the TTF gas exchange. An amendment to the Temporary Crisis Framework for State aid shall be presented before the end of October with the aim to better support companies.

Energy System

The EC presented its plan for the digitalisation of the energy system in order to improve the efficient use of energy resources through the promotion of investments in digital electricity infrastructure and better coordination within the Union.

Energy and Economy

The leaders of the EU Member States adopted a set of conclusions on "Energy and Economy", calling on the EC and Member States to submit concrete decisions on a range of measures, including a temporary emergency price cap on the benchmark European gas trading hub and a voluntary joint purchasing of gas.

■ Critical Infrastructure

The EC released its proposal to strengthen the resilience of EU critical infrastructure. Priority should be given to key sectors such as energy, digital infrastructure, transport and space.

■ State Aid – RDI Framework

The EC adopted a revised Communication on State aid rules for research, development and innovation, which sets out the rules under which Member States can grant state aid to companies for RDI activities. The revised framework includes a number of adjustments to reflect regulatory, economic and technological developments and to align the rules to the current EU policy priorities such as the European Green Deal.

■■ Alternative Fuels Infrastructure Regulation

The European Parliament adopted its position on the proposal on alternative fuels and infrastructure regulation (AFIR). The new rules, which are part of the "Fit for 55 in 2030 package" - the European plan to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by at least 55% by 2030 compared to 1990 levels, aim at spurring the deployment of recharging and alternative refuelling stations for cars, trucks, trains and planes and supporting the uptake of sustainable vehicles. Lawmakers agreed to set minimum mandatory national targets for the deployment of alternative fuels infrastructure and Member States will have to present their plans by 2024 on how to achieve it. Alternative refuelling stations should be accessible to all vehicle brands and payment should be easy. To ensure compliance, lawmakers suggest the introduction of penalties. Inter-institutional negotiations with the Council on the final version of the regulation can now start.

■ Intelligent Transport Systems

The Transport Committee of the European Parliament will vote on 26 October on the amendments to the proposal for the deployment of intelligent transport systems and interfaces with other modes of transport. The proposal aims to update the existing ITS Directive, expanding its scope to include new challenges.

■ Chips Act

The Presidency of the Council released its second final compromise text on the Chips Act with the aim to reach

an agreement on the text at the Competitiveness Council on 1 December. There are still some outstanding issues to be addressed by EU Member States, including the scope of the type of semiconductors covered by the rules.
